

Herm Island

Catch the ferry from St Peter Port to the beautiful paradise Island of Herm just three miles off of the coast of St Peter Port; a mere 20 minutes away by ferry.

Your guide will meet you on arrival and will walk you from the harbour past the quaint cottages and mermaid tavern public house toward the common. Follow the sandy track east and keep going until you hit the sea. Welcome to beautiful Shell Beach! Pick your own private spot to relax for 15 minutes and soak up the atmosphere.

Your guide will lead you around the coastal path south to the beautiful Belvoir Bay before climbing the short hill to Le Manoir, with its ox-shoeing stocks. Your guide will show you the tiny chapel of St Tugual, which dates from the days of my Norman ancestors and tell you more about the Islands history and Herm lifestyle. Your guide will escort you down The Drive - said to be haunted by a Monk - for souvenir shopping in the piazza before lunch at The White House Hotel.

Return by ferry to Guernsey.

Sark Island

Catch the sark boat from St Peter Port.

Meet your guide and take the tractor bus, known as the 'toast rack', up to the village. Meet your horse and carriage and enjoy a tour of this magical island – Europe's last remaining feudal state

You will find breathtaking scenery in abundance from La Seigneurie gardens to wooded valleys and cliff tops filled with flora and fauna.

Your driver can tell you its secrets - they have all passed Sark's low-speed equivalent of 'the Knowledge'. Enjoy the look out over Herm and Guernsey from La Coupée before returning to the avenue for an unhurried lunch in a restaurant garden.

Relax at the heart of Britain's quietest capital, for souvenir shopping and afternoon tea, before your guide escorts you back to the harbour to catch the ferry back to Guernsey.
